President's Report

Club Projects:

You will have noticed by now that the equipment shed is finally finished after a long wait with council approvals and rain. The PA system installation has also been completed with funding from the Motorline BMW sponsorship.

This month we have also had the workers from Logan West Community Projects Group on the grounds doing several jobs and painting the club house exterior. All labour was provided free of charge and the club paid only for materials. The full list of jobs completed was:

- Club house exterior painting
- Concrete ramps into the shed
- Jump rails painted
- Waterline installed to the quarantine yards
- Permanent cover built over quarantine yards
- A HUGE amount of brush cutting along the street front, around the shed and throughout the yards and parking areas.

We have also had Logan City Council on site to install drainage and a driveway over the causeway to the gear check area. This work was paid for by LCC and resolves the safety risk of the unsightly drain with broken concrete and stagnant water. Thanks to Cr. Hajnal Black and the LCC Community Infrastructure services dept. for getting this done.

House Keeping:

Just a quick word on the arenas – please make sure you lock the gates to the sand arenas and the enclosed arena when you finish riding and always pick up any manure your horse may drop in the arenas. Also, please be sure to pick up your rubbish, and any other rubbish that may be lying around, and put it in the industrial bin.

Clinics and social groups:

There are a few items to add to your calendar for clinics etc. this month.

Rebel Morrow Show Jumping Clinic – The first Rebel Morrow clinic on May 14th received excellent feedback, but numbers were low. The second clinic is coming up June 12th. This is a great opportunity for a very well-priced (grant subsidised) lesson with an Australian Olympian. Rebel is a fantastic coach, very friendly and down to earth in her approach so riders of all ages and abilities are catered for. Please support the clinic and the EQ grant by attending. Even if you don't intend to compete at show jumping, it's great training for posture, seat and balance and for horse fitness.

'Nervous Neddies' Riding Group Report - written by Angela Reinecke (Organiser)

Our very first session of the Saturday Nervous Nedly social group started off well thanks to the lovely Susie Cooper was our coach for that particular group session. I had a very shaky start to the afternoon in that I was unable to load my boy Gus in the float and felt very flustered having to send out an SOS call to a friend at the very last minute to come and give me a hand, only to have him load a millisecond before she arrived to help me. His playing up seemed to set the tone for the afternoon because everything that could go wrong, did go wrong for me. He was feeling my nervous anticipation... poor Ella and her mum were waiting very patiently when we got there only a few minutes late.

For the lesson Susie made an assessment of our various riding abilities and knowledge by revising the 'Use of the Aids':

What does each aid control?

Your seat controls:

1. Rhythm
2. Speed
3. Length of stride
4. Downward transitions
5. The position of your horse's body

Your legs control:

1. The position of your horse's hind legs
2. They give aids
3. They ask for activity

Your reins control:

1. Flexion at the poll to the left and right
2. Flexion in at the jaw
3. The length of your horse's neck
4. The position of the forehead

The next topic we covered was how to use the aids to get a specific response.

The seat is used in 4 different ways:

1. Passive following seat - keeping the rhythm, speed and gait the same
2. Driving seat - increasing the length of stride and speed
3. Controlling the position of your horse's body

The legs are used to:

1. Control the position of the hind legs
 - when you place a leg behind the girth you are preventing the horses hindquarters from swinging out
 - when you use one leg behind the girth you ask the horse to displace his hindquarters sideways
2. Give aids
 - close both calves to ask for an upward transition either from gait to gait or within the gait for a lengthening
 - swing your outside leg behind the girth in a windshield wiper movement to ask for canter depart
3. Ask for more activity
 - squeeze with your inside calf on the girth to ask for more energy or activity

Reins:

1. Flexion to left and right
2. Flexion at jaw
3. The length of neck
4. Controlling the position of the forehead

There were three riders in the group and Susie managed to get us all moving without any collisions to put us through our paces. Susie very quickly established key points in our riding that needed improvement. I have had a very long struggle with contact especially maintaining the contact while moving through the gaits. My problem is that I try too hard and start tensing up and sending the wrong signals to the horse and so Susie's solution to that was to walk Gus in a circle while gently flexing his head and sponging the rein to invite the contact. For some athletic ability comes easily and others like myself it is an uphill battle all the way to the finish line. Towards the end of the session I had a little softening happening so there was a little achievement there for me and if you have a look at those pictures of me from the Saturday session you will see exactly what I am referring to with Gus' head in the air-evading the contact with the bit.

We all had a good time and each of us walked away having accomplished something to give us more confidence and to make us better riders. Our thanks go to Susie for her patience and persistence.

'Nervous Neddies' Riding Group Report - written by Angela Reinecke (Organiser)

Friday Afternoon lesson with Belinda Russo (8th April 2011).

Fridays are the "mature girls" session of the Nervous Neddies social group and once again there were three ladies in this group. Three seems to be the lucky number for us.

For this particular session we were invited to ride at Benalbyn Lodge in the under cover arena because old mother nature was being fickle and raining at the most inconvenient of times. Wow, what great facilities Benalbyn has - mirrors, grandstands and toilets. **It doesn't take much to keep us happy and I definitely want one of those...are you listening Santa?**

Before we started the lesson we gave the horses a chance to have a little look around just in case they wanted to balk at the mirrors or rather at the horses inside the mirrors. Fortunately the horses behaved as if they have done this a million times **before and did not put a foot wrong because that is a human trait after all...**

Belinda had the group concentrate on the first three important ingredients in the training scale: Rhythm, Suppleness and Contact. These steps are very closely interlinked because you will not be able to maintain one without the other. The first three steps in the training scale is the first phase of understanding and building confidence in the young horse. One of the horses in the group was a 3 year old Warmblood mare who was coping so well with all the new experiences - perhaps it was **Mary's person that kept her so cool and calm.**

Once again the problem I have with maintaining contact emerged and Belinda put me straight to work on walking circles so that Gus would round down and accept the bit. I was overly cautious with taking up the contact so Belinda gave me a ridden demonstration of exactly what was required to get the horse rounded and keep him that way. In no time at all she had him working round and seeking contact and she made it look so easy.

Our next challenge was riding walk trot transitions concentrating on rhythm and contact. Once we had done a few circuits of transitions, then came the leg yielding part of lateral work. Being an absolute beginner I had never ridden a proper leg yield before and was quite surprised at the amount of discomfort arising from using dormant muscle groups and so Belinda so aptly reminded me, ..no pain no gain!

So what are the aids for Leg yielding.....for a leg yield to the right away from your left leg:

1. Your seat

- sit squarely over the middle of your horse.

Your legs:

2. Right leg:-

- right leg on the girth for forward movement.

- during leg yields your horse should go 50% forward, and 50% sideways.

3. Left leg:-

- your left leg asks for sideways movement so place your leg 7.5 cm to 10cm behind the girth.

- **if your horse doesn't go sideways enough, this leg should become active by squeezing and releasing a couple of times until the horse goes sideways.**

4. Reins:-

- in the leg yield your horses spine is straight but he is flexed at the poll away from the direction of movement.

I walked away from this session feeling motivated and re-energised. Ready to go home and practice, practice and practice but **first....where is the glass of red pain killing potion ?**
